Similes: make a comparison between two Metaphors: state a comparison between two different things, normally using *like* or *as.* different things, often using *is* or *was*.

Onomatopoeia: words that imitate sounds Hyperbole: language that exaggerates.

Personification: gives human characteristics to **Alliteration:** when words beginning with the things that are not human. same sound are grouped together
